



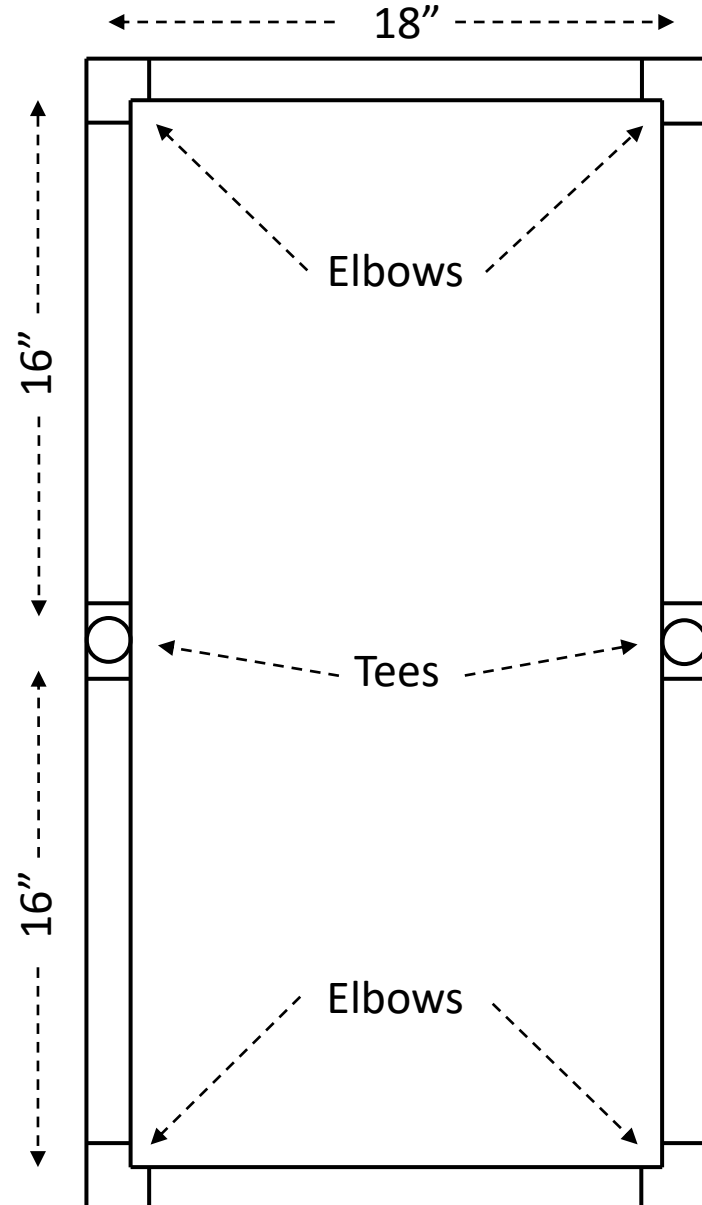
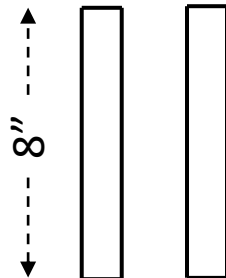
## PVC Pipe and Firing Strip Target Stand

List of materials required:

- 1 – 10' section of 1 ½" PVC Tubing**
- 2 – PVC "T" Connections**
- 4 – PVC 90deg Elbow Connections**
- 1 – can of PVC Cement / can of primer if needed**
  
- 2 – 1"x2"x8' Firing Strips
- 4 – Plastic bolts and nuts (toilet bowl seat hardware)

- Glue all the PVC pieces together except for the Uprights. Removable Uprights will permit easier transport and storage as well as replacement if broken by gunshot.
- Glue sets quickly so work in sections and lay flat as you connect the various sections together.

2 – Uprights to fit into the "tees"





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**2 – 1"x2"x8' Firing Strips**

**4 – Plastic bolts and nuts (toilet bowl seat hardware)**

- Cut firing fur to desired height for the 2 vertical legs of the target holder. Example shows 72" but could be longer or shorter to suit your needs and transportation limitations.
- Cut remaining firing strip pieces to make 2 -- 24" crossbars.
- Drill 3/8" holes sized for plastic hardware in vertical strips at spaced intervals to suit desired target backing and for flexibility.
- Drill 3/8" holes in the horizontal crossbars to fit.
- Attach crossbars to vertical strips with plastic hardware.

At the range:

- Insert PVC Uprights into base
- Insert target holder frame into PVC Uprights
- Staple or binder clip cardboard backer to frame.
- Staple target to cardboard.
- Weight base if needed due to wind.
- Enjoy shooting to your hearts content.
